- *To strengthen organizations that help veterans find fulfilling and sustaining roles in society and with their families.**
- *To provide funding for on-the-job training for veterans.**
- *To provide funding for professional talking books and Braille books for veterans.**

SUPPORTING various other projects

The Veterans Support Network (VSN) also provides funding for two wonderful activities done by the Military Hospitality Alliance (MHA) which, since 2003, has held a Military Culinary Competition, outside Marine Barracks in Washington, DC, and the Enlisted Aide of the Year Award, held in conjunction with the USO at the Ritz Carlton in Pentagon City. Together, MHA has paid out \$100,000 in prize money to military enlisted personnel. It provides great education as well as bragging rights for which service has the best cooks and the best enlisted aides who support the Admirals and Generals.
